

**Sara Jordan-McLachlan is a wildlife biologist** based in the city of Calgary, Alberta, Canada. Growing up, Sara always had dreams of studying wild cats. After completing her BSc in Zoology from the University of Calgary in 2006, Sara was fortunate enough to have the opportunity to work on the Central East Slopes Cougar Study in Western Alberta. In addition to Calgary Captured work, Sara is a naturalist with the Weaselhead/Glenmore Park Preservation Society, a member of the City's BiodiverCity Advisory Committee, ECO Canada, the International Society for Endangered Cats, and the Alberta Chapter of the Wildlife Society.
